WHEREAS, the United Nations Association Denver Chapter, Our Secure Future, and One Earth Future International Day of Peace Forum exist to raise the profile of the International Day of Peace and to affirm peace as a real alternative to the violence we see every day in the news by sharing activities and experiences with organizations around the world inspiring engagement in Peace Day; and

WHEREAS, members of the Denver community participate in the International Day of Peace Forum to educate the public, raise awareness of the International Day of Peace, and stand in solidarity with the international community to work for the day all citizens of the world can live together in harmony;
